The Illinois Prescription Monitoring Program (ILPMP) is an electronic database that collects, tracks and stores reported data for controlled substances in schedules II-V and selected drugs of interest, as well as other types of healthcare information.

Healthcare providers and their designees can view 12 months of a patient's prescription history to assist with clinical decisions regarding prescribing and dispensing. Prescribers can also view a history of prescriptions dispensed under their DEA number.

Dispensers, prescribers, and their designees can register for an account at ILPMP.org. The data in the ILPMP database is reported by pharmacies and other state departments.

The ILPMP does not guarantee the complete accuracy of a patient's prescription history or healthcare information as it is dependent on the information provided. If you notice an error in reporting, please email the ILPMP at dhs.pmp@illinois.gov.
