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### New Opioid Treatment Program Reporting Feature on ILPMP website

In light of **Public Act 102-0527**, which mandates Opioid Treatment Program (OTP) reporting data to the Illinois Prescription Monitoring Program with patient written consent, the new OTP feature is now live on ILPMP.org. Prescribers that are in direct care of patients with a diagnosis of substance use disorder (SUD) will have access to prescription drug history including dosages. This information is shared with healthcare providers to ensure that patients receive the safest and best care possible. Providers can have the information needed to reduce the risk of potential drug to drug interactions. In the case of hospital admission, quick access to accurate dosing information may prevent the need for unnecessary dose reductions. Expansion to PMPnow and integrated connections are anticipated by 2024. For more information, see our FAQs below and on ILPMP.org.

ILPMP Opioid Treatment Program Reporting FAQs



#### **Q: Is OTP real-time data?**

**A**: No. OTP data has a lag time of up to 1 week. ILPMP receives a new data file from SUPR every Wednesday; it is then uploaded to the database every Thursday. Because of this, we highly recommend clicking the facility link provided on the patient's profile to call and verify the medication dosage.

#### Q: How will OTP data be stored within ILPMP?

**A**: OTP data is housed separately from Illinois retail pharmacy data. Due to 42 CFR Part 2 privacy and security measure, OTP data has additional security standards in which ILPMP must comply by.

## Q: I'm a provider, how will I know when a patient has OTP data to view on the patient profile?

**A:** If a patient is enrolled into an OTP facility an OTP icon will appear in the icon row. As you click on the OTP Data icon a pop up will appear stating "This patient is enrolled in an Opioid Treatment Program (OTP). Information contained in the OTP data icon has additional privacy and confidentiality protections under Federal Regulation 42 CFR Part 2. Please click "I agree" to verify that you are involved in the direct care of this patient."




