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ILPMP Awarded CDC OD2A-S Grant



The Illinois Department of Human Services' Prescription Monitoring Program (ILPMP) applied as a sub-recipient and was awarded the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Overdose Data to Action in States (OD2A-S) grant in the amount of \$633,374 each year for five years pending federal funding allocations.

The Data-Informed Overdose Prevention in Illinois Project is a collaboration that the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) recognized as a multisector, multijurisdictional, statewide collaboration.

The OD2A-S grant will benefit the PMP in various ways including outcomes such as decreased fatal drug overdoses; decreased illicit opioid and stimulant use, including co-use with other substances, Opioid Use Disorder (OUD), and Stimulant Use Disorder (StUD); improved health equity among groups disproportionately affected by the overdose epidemic and those previously underserved by overdose prevention programs and the healthcare system; and decreased stigma related to substance use and overdose.

Projects for the next five years include: develop trainings on the management of pain focusing on dissemination to all clinicians who may treat acute, subacute, and chronic pain in outpatient settings; provide training to encourage awareness of safe prescribing practices and provide recommendations for tapering opioids; expand PMP data sharing across state lines/interstate interoperability; ensuring that PDMPs are easy to use and access by clinicians; ensure the PMP is accessible to all clinicians through user interface improvements such as single sign-on, access delegation, and electronic health records (EHR) integration; and in collaboration with other State PDMPs, and LogiCoy, ILPMP will continue to share data via the RxCheck hub.

ILPMP Designee Updates



Q: How many designees may utilize the ILPMP for patient care after obtaining access authorization from the ILPMP staff?

A: The prescriber or dispenser shall only have up to **five** designees, with the exception of a hospital or their authorized location such as a long-term care facility/opioid treatment facility.

Q: What type of licensed or non-licensed designee are authorized? **A**: Registered Nurse, Licensed Practical Nurse, Pharmacy Technician, Student Pharmacist, Certified Medical Assistant, Dental Hygienist, or Dental Assistant
