What is the PMP?

The Illinois Prescription Monitoring Program (PMP) collects information on controlled substance prescriptions dispensed in Illinois. The PMP web site allows prescribers and dispensers to view a current or prospective patient's prescription history.

Goal

The goal of the PMP is to assist prescribers and dispensers in the effective treatment of patients seeking medical care.

Free

Using the PMP website is free, and is intended to assist medical providers to better serve their patients.

Easy to Use

It is minimally disruptive to healthcare providers and there is no barrier to patient therapies.



What information does the PMP provide?

- Schedules II-V controlled substance prescription information.
- Records viewable for 12 months and kept on record for two years.

Who submits prescription data?

A Retail pharmacies dispensing in Illinois are mandated to report on a weekly basis (720 ILCS 570/316).

Health Care Focused

The PMP is an electronic tool used to assist healthcare providers with accurate patient specific data to prevent potential drug interactions or accidental overdose.

Preventing Abuse and Diversion

The PMP can help prevent the misuse, abuse and diversion of controlled substance medications.

Mobile Accessibility

The PMP web site provides full functional availability for mobile devices.

24/7 Access

The web site provides users with 24-hour and immediate access to their patient's prescription history.

View Your Prescribing History

The PMP allows prescribers to view a complete history of the prescriptions dispensed under his or her DEA number.

Drug Treatment

The PMP web site includes a brief intervention form and a link to SAMSHA treatment centers.
