#### **ILPMP Launches Two New Accredited Continuing Education Modules for Pharmacists**



In partnership with Southern Illinois University Edwardsville, the ILPMP has developed two additional continuing education modules: *Controversies in Opioid Conversions and Equianalgesic Tables* and *Pain Management in Patients with Renal or Hepatic Dysfunction*. These new continuing education modules are accredited by the Illinois Pharmacists Association (IPhA) and available free of charge. The primary target audience is practicing pharmacists. #### **ILPMP Awarded New Funding Opportunity**

The Illinois Department of Human Services' ILPMP was awarded the Bureau of Justice Assistance, Office of Justice Programs, Harold Rogers Prescription Drug



Monitoring Program grant totaling \$2,000,000 for a 24-month period.

This funding will support a broad range of enhancements across ILPMP's technical infrastructure, reporting capabilities, and clinical resources.

The projects proposed for the Information Technology Team include designing a new data processing pipeline to automate data uploads; redesigning the website for better mobile device access; implementing a website crawler to identify bad links; improving website to allow for out of state searches through RxCheck; sharing data with additional State PMPs; improving how the system displays data, tables, and graphs; and designing dynamic tables and graphs.

The IL PMPnow Team will collaborate with technical support vendors to incorporate overdose data into the Electronic Health Record system connections; create a data quality designee role for data reporting; develop pharmacy compliance dashboards; enhance report building and search functionality; provide education on report building; implement a standard reporting process for Long Term Care facilities; expand required submission fields; and improve overall reporting.

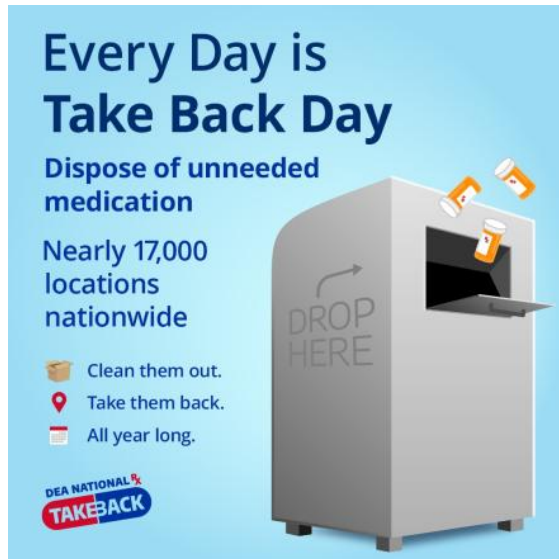
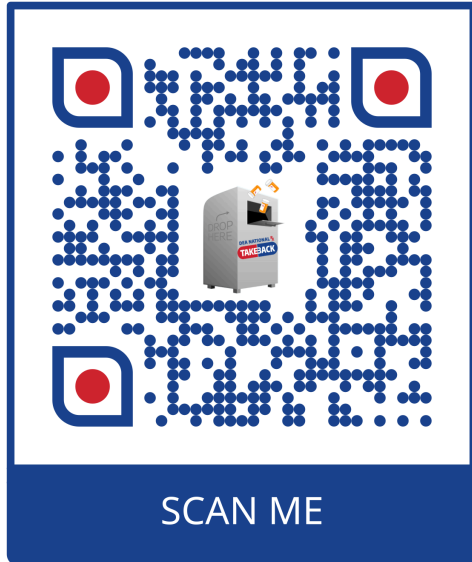
The Clinical Team will collaborate with a vendor to develop and disseminate guidance materials on overdose data displayed on the ILPMP and create a resource page on the ILPMP website.

Projects proposed for this funding opportunity will serve and benefit all Illinois prescribers, dispensers, healthcare providers, and the more than 12.72 million Illinois residents. The projects will also serve surrounding States' providers and residents.

### **FDA approved another over-the-counter intranasal naloxone product**

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved another over-the-counter (OTC) intranasal naloxone product, Rextovy, a 4 milligram (mg) naloxone hydrochloride nasal spray for the emergency treatment of opioid overdose. Consumers may directly purchase this product without a prescription in places such as pharmacies, convenience stores, and online.

### Attention to all data submitters using an sFTP upload

Recently we were made aware of some data submitters using the test systems (UAT) sFTP address to submit daily dispensation files following testing in ASAP 5.0.

If the current sFTP address contains "uat," this must be changed to the production address. To view the appropriate set up for sFTP uploads in production, review section 10 sFTP Account (Secure File Transfer Protocol) of the 2025 Illinois Data Submitters Guide starting on page 40.

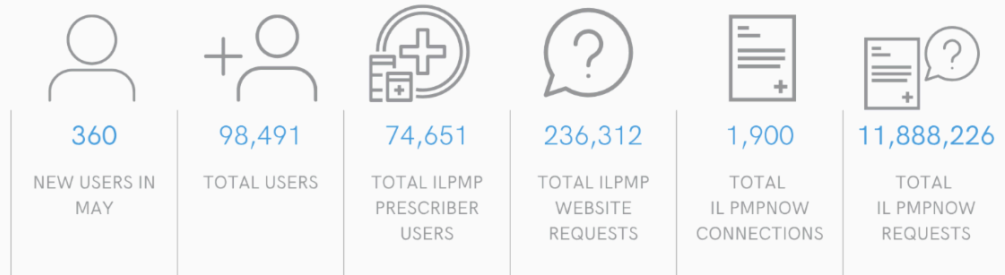
